#### MANAGEMENT - SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST

#### **Brief Description of Position:**

Under the direction of the District Superintendent and the Director of Special Education/District Psychologist, provides psychological services to selected schools including testing, consulting, and counseling to assist them in meeting the psychological, emotional, and educational needs of pupils.

## Major Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Administers individual intelligence tests, achievement tests, personality tests, language development tests, tests to measure perceptual and motor development, and others as needed.
- 2. Administers or supervises the administration of group achievement and diagnostic tests.
- 3. Evaluates and interprets all testing and makes recommendations for placement both in special education classes and in regular classes of appropriate grade and class level.
- 4. Prepares comprehensive reports that include the results from all members of the IEP Team.
- 5. Assists with statistical reports required for specially funded programs; also provides input in preparation of an annual report to the Board evaluating the results of the District=s group testing program.
- 6. Participates in Individualized Educational Placement (IEP) meetings to meet the state requirements for placement, goal-setting, on-going evaluation, and review of all students in special education classes.
- 7. Makes a psycho-educational assessment and diagnosis of specific learning and behavioral disabilities, including case study evaluation, recommendations for remediation or placement, and periodic reevaluation of such students.
- 8. Interprets the findings of the individual psychological evaluation of a student to his parents; counsels with parents regarding the student=s learning and adjustments needs; recommends ways that the parents can help and other available resources.
- 9. Works together with teachers to implement individual prescriptive teaching and other remediation designed to help overcome the learning and behavior problems of students.
- 10. Evaluates and makes recommendations regarding students being considered for retention, acceleration, or a different class level.
- 11. Counsels individual students in relation to their psycho-educational needs.
- 12. Works as a team with community agencies and other concerned professionals.
- Works closely with administrators, regular and special education teachers, and paraprofessionals in program development and evaluation.
- Apprises teachers of new techniques and materials and their use with individual students.
- 15. Maintains files of on-going psychological evaluations of the all students referred.
- Participates in faculty meetings, student study teams, parent conferences, in-service training, and other school district and community groups.

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- 17. Participates on crisis management teams, school/district safety teams, Medi-Cal Advisory Committee, and other related teams and committees as appropriate.
- 18. Conducts conflict resolution activities with students and assists with crisis management at school sites.
- 19. Serves as a resource to teachers and administrators on legal and procedural issues related to special education and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act.
- 20. Consults with other psychologists, physicians, and agencies to coordinate treatment and interventions for students and their families.
- 21. When appropriate, participates in cases of promotion, retention, and acceleration.

#### Supervision Exercised or Received:

Under the general direction of the Director of Special Education/District Psychologist; Under the immediate direction of the site administrator while performing services on the school site.

# POSITION QUALIFICATIONS

#### **Minimum Qualifications:**

Credential:

General Pupil Personnel Services with the authorization to serve as Psychologist or Standard Designated Services in Pupil Personnel with the Psychologist authorization.

**Education**:

Masters Degree, including all courses needed to meet credential requirements.

Experience:

Successful classroom teaching or counseling experience is desirable. Advanced work in clinical psychology beyond the level of work required for the credential is desirable.

Personal Qualities:

Appearance, grooming, and personality which establishes a desirable example for pupils; Ability to meet district standards for physical and mental health; Better than average recommendation from student supervisors or other professionals who have observed personal characteristics, scholastic attainment, and performance of the individual; Must possess mature judgement and ability to oversion individual.

Must possess mature judgement and ability to exercise individual

initiative; Must be able to develop empathy with parents and pupils; Skills

in English and Spanish are preferred.
